Samer K. Elbabaa, M.D., FAAP, FAANS, FACS Chief, Pediatric Neurosurgery Director, Leon Pediatric Neuroscience Center of Excellence Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children Professor of Neurosurgery, University of Central Florida College of Medicine

Dr. Elbabaa is board certified by the American Board of Neurological Surgery (ABNS) and the American Board of Pediatric Neurological Surgery (ABPNS). His areas of expertise include micro-neurosurgical treatment of pediatric brain tumors, skull base tumors, cerebrovascular malformations and spinal cord tumors. His areas of interest also include neuro-endoscopic management of hydrocephalus and brain tumors, pediatric craniofacial surgery, epilepsy surgery, cranio-cervical junctional anomalies and fetal in-utero neurosurgery. He is considered one of the most experienced fetal in-utero spina bifida neurosurgeons in the world. A world-renowned pediatric neurosurgeon and an accomplished researcher, Dr. Elbabaa frequently serves as a visiting professor, guest lecturer and conference speaker worldwide. He serves as Section Editor for Pediatric Neurosurgery and Hydrocephalus in the World Neurosurgery Journal. Dr. Elbabaa completed his residency in neurological surgery at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and clinical fellowship in pediatric neurosurgery at The Cleveland Clinic. He is a fellow of the American Association of Neurological Surgeons and of the American College of Surgeons, and he is a member of Congress of Neurological Surgeons and the International Society of Pediatric Neurosurgeons. He also serves on numerous committees and executive boards for national and international professional neurosurgical organizations. He currently serves on the executive board of the International Federation of Neuroendoscopy (IFNE) and, most recently, served as Chairman of the 2019 IFNE World Congress of Neuroendoscopy in Orlando, FL.



Brent A. Golden, D.D.S., M.D., FACS Pediatric Craniomaxillofacial Surgery Department of Children's Surgery Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children

Brent Golden was born and raised in Asheville, North Carolina and still considers himself a child of the Appalachian mountains. He earned his dental and medical degrees from the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill where he graduated with distinction. He completed an internship and John Peter Smith in Fort Worth, Texas before beginning his surgical residency. His oral and maxillofacial surgery residency was also at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and he followed this with a pediatric craniomaxillofacial surgery fellowship at Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children, at Orlando Health with Dr. Ramon L. Ruiz. Following his fellowship, Dr. Golden served on the faculty at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill as an Assistant Professor with a focus on pediatric surgical care under the mentorship of Dr. Timothy Turvey. In 2015, Dr. Golden joined the pediatric craniomaxillofacial surgery team and Department of Children's Surgery at the Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children, at Orlando Health where he is able to focus 100% of his practice on pediatric surgery. He is an integral part of the Cleft and Craniofacial Disorders surgical program and faculty for one of 10 fellowships in pediatric craniomaxillofacial surgery in the US. He is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. In addition to Dr. Golden's subspecialty clinical practice in pediatric craniomaxillofacial surgery, he continues to formalize his interest in surgical quality and outcomes.



Marc S. Levy, M.D., FACS Division Chief, Pediatric Surgery Associate Director, Trauma Surgery Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children

Marc Levy, MD, is the Division Chief of the Pediatric Surgery Specialty Practice at the Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children. He is a member of the Department of Children's Surgery where he serves as Associate Director of the Trauma Program and Director of Pediatric Surgical Education for Orlando Health. He is certified by the American Board of Surgery with special qualifications in Pediatric Surgery. After earning his undergraduate degree in biomedical engineering from Vanderbilt University, Dr. Levy graduated from the University of South Florida College of Medicine. He went on to complete General Surgery residency at Orlando Regional Medical Center, fellowship in extracorporeal life support and critical care at Boston Children's Hospital, and subspecialty fellowship training in Pediatric Surgery at the Arkansas Children's Hospital. Dr. Levy joined the faculty at the Arnold Palmer Medical Center in 1998 and maintains a full scope pediatric surgical practice. He has authored numerous peer reviewed articles in the Journal of Pediatric Surgery and Annals of Surgery and is a frequently invited speaker. Dr. Levy was one of the trauma surgeons responding to the mass casualties of the Pulse Nightclub shooting. He is a frequently invited speaker and has authored a number of peer reviewed articles on the subject of gun violence, mass shootings, and advocacy. Dr. Levy serves as a special consultant for the American College of Surgeons Injury Prevention and Control Committee. In 2018, Dr. Levy was awarded the Atlantic Institute Peace and Dialogue Award.
