### **KEYNOTE SPEAKER**



Gurjit Sandhu, PhD
Vice Chair of Resident Professional Development
Associate Professor, Surgery & Learning Health Sciences
Faculty Associate, Wellness Office

Dr. Gurjit Sandhu is a faculty member in the Department of Surgery. Dr. Sandhu completed her B.A. in 1996 from the University of British Columbia, Canada and earned her PhD in 2006 from Queen's University, Canada. She was the Educational Developer for Postgraduate Medical Education at Queen's University before joining the faculty at the University of Michigan in November 2013. Dr. Sandhu's research concentrates on progressive entrustment and graduated autonomy in surgical education. More broadly, her work focuses on the scholarship of teaching

 $and \ learning, specifically \ looking \ at \ professional \ education, teaching \ methods \ and \ assessment. \ Dr. \ Sandhu \ also \ uses \ her \ strengths \ as \ a \ qualitative \ researcher \ to \ support \ her \ work \ on \ social \ accountability \ in \ medical \ education, health \ equity \ and \ disparities, and \ global \ health.$ 

"Interpersonal Interactions: Teaching, Learning and Trust in the Operating Room:" The presentation will have 3 areas of focus: Background on situational awareness; Intraoperative entrustment; Motivational styles. This presentation will build on the awareness that the surgical educational environment is experiencing a shift in structure and approaches. The adoption of enhanced teaching/learning agility from both faculty and trainees will be discussed. Behaviors that enhance and inhibit trust in the operating room will be described, alongside strategies for developing a shared mental model of entrustment. Finally, motivational styles – how individuals orient themselves to achieve a goal – and their intersection with intraoperative entrustment will be explored.
