Belinda Chen, MD
Assistant Professor of Medicine
Director, Faculty Development Programs in Curriculum Development
Johns Hopkins School of Medicine

Dr. Chen thrives in diverse mentorship roles, deriving much satisfaction from being able to apply her skills in medicine and teaching to

helping students, residents, and faculty rise towards the ideals that inspired each to want to become a healer. She teaches Community-Oriented Primary Care and precept in the resident continuity clinic. She is one of the editors and authors for the third edition of the standard reference book for medical curriculum developers: Curriculum Development for Medical Education: a Six-Step Approach (JHU Press). In 2017, she won the Hopkins Institute for Excellence in Education (IEE) Award for Teaching Excellence for part-time faculty and was also a co-winner of the IEE Educational Innovations Award. Most recently in 2020, she was awarded the Professor's Award for Excellence in Teaching.



Thomas Scalea, MD
Professor of Shock Trauma
University of Maryland

Dr. Scalea was named a "Top Doctor" in Trauma - Emergency Medicine by *Baltimore* magazine in 2020 and has made significant contributions to trauma care and education.

After completing his medical degree and a trauma fellowship, he rebuilt King's County Hospital's trauma services into a nationally recognized program. In 1997, he became Physician-in-Chief at the University of Maryland R Adams Cowley Shock Trauma Center, where he expanded services, streamlined protocols, and increased annual patient admissions from 5,800 to over 7,700. He established the GO Team, a 24/7 rapid-response unit for critical emergencies, and integrated trauma education as a required medical school rotation. Dr. Scalea also developed a region-wide critical care program, overseeing nine Intensive Care Units and over 100 beds. A practicing surgeon and prolific researcher, he continues to lead advancements in trauma care with a focus on innovation and education.
