

Overview

The mission of the AACMFS is to improve the health and quality of life of patients with congenital and acquired CMF disorders by the advancement of knowledge of the science and art of CMF surgery. Keynote speakers will discuss trends in academic healthcare enterprises important to surgical subspecialties and new directions in evaluation and treatment of concussions. Fellows of the Academy who have submitted abstracts will present current research and innovations in practice in the areas of pediatric craniomaxillofacial surgery, trauma, head and neck oncology, reconstruction and education and training. The goal of this activity is to bring together experts in their respective fields to share information regarding patients with craniomaxillofacial disorders and discuss options for improving patient care.

Target Audience

This scientific session is for oral and maxillofacial surgeons who are Fellows of the AACMFS who have come together to advance their fields of practice and who are interested in sharing experiences and setting future direction.

Professional Practice Gaps

Fellows of the AACMFS are individuals who are regularly engaged in major craniomaxillofacial surgery both within academic centers and elsewhere. It is essential they stay abreast of the decisions being made that impact the length of training programs as well as the content. As the practice of medicine evolves in this specialty, Fellows need access to the latest research of their colleagues, so they can improve OMS patient outcomes.

Assessment of Need

A survey conducted by the American College of Surgeons revealed that training programs are changing and there is a steady and continual erosion of the basic science curricula. There is a concern regarding adequately preparing surgical residents for the complexities of patient care, as well as for specialty board examinations, if the core sciences are minimized to the point of omission. At issue is creating a continuum of training that focuses on allowing residents to train to their level of interest and competence, while utilizing optimal resources based upon regional politics and access to clinical material. Consideration should be given to having fellowships and residencies accredited by the ACGME and/or the ACS in order to alleviate concerns over the integration of dentistry into health education.

Methodology-Format

This course is structured to be highly interactive where Fellows present five minute abstracts with a ten minute discussion period. Keynote speakers will also present lectures with discussion sessions. Abstracts are printed for reference at the meeting and are available post meeting.

Objectives

Upon completion of this scientific session the attendee should be able to:

- I. Discuss the challenges in maxillofacial reconstruction, and approaches to overcome them.
- 2. Examine novel insights into cancer biology and strategies for using the immune system to combat disease.
- 3. Discuss the recognition of oral and maxillofacial surgery as a surgical specialty by existing medical institutions, such as the American College of Surgeons.
- Critique abstracts of research studies as they relate to craniomaxillofacial patient populations, diseases and treatment options and the implications for changes in practice.
- 5. Formulate a plan of action related to the challenges facing the field of dentistry and craniomaxillofacial surgeon training programs.
